

## Education sessions at this year's conference




Speakers focused on various medical, ethical and psychosocial aspects and issues of cancer in adolescents.

Dr. Ronald Barr's presentations included the long-term complications of ALL. Dr. Barr is Chief of Service in the Children's Hospital, Hamilton, Ontario.

Dr. Conrad Fernandez, IWK Health Centre explored ethical issues of consent for adolescents. Dr. Gillian Graves, also with the IWK Health Centre - gave a comprehensive overview of vaginal bleeding and other gynecological complications of young women undergoing chemotherapy. Clinical psychologist, Dr. Marc Blumberg discussed psychosocial needs and approaches to families who have an adolescent with cancer.

Dr. Elizabeth Cummings, IWK Endocrinologist, discussed healthy living life styles for all children. Dr. Christy Simpson, PhD with the Department of Bioethics at Dalhousie University explored the role of hope in health care.
