Important -Guideline Correction!


The APPHON supportive care guideline, Guidelines for Management of Constipation, revised July 2005, has an error. On page 3, under stimulant laxatives - bisacodyl (Dulcolax), it states it should be taken within one hour of antacids or milk. This is incorrect. It should state, "Do not take within one hour of antacids or milk." This has been corrected on the website and corrected hardcopies will be sent to those with binders.

Levels of Care

Mickie Al-Molky, our Levels of Care coordinator, presented at a concurrent session at the 14th International Cancer Care Nursing Conference in Toronto held September 26- October 1. Reports are she did an excellent job presenting on the APPHON Levels of Care.

The Levels of Care implementation is alive and well, albeit inconspicuous to many. Revisions of documents and tools, data collection, and progress, continue.

APON's Pediatric Chemotherapy and Biotherapy Provider Program



APON's Pediatric Chemotherapy and Biotherapy Provider Program was developed to help standardize the education nurses in regard of administration of chemotherapy biotherapy in Paediatrics. There is a national and international move toward a current standardized knowledge base for health professionals who care for oncology / haematology patients and families. APON has been in existence for 30 years, and is the leading organization in pediatric oncology / haematology for nursing. In the Atlantic Province, we now have this course available to us, and it is being offered to APPHON members in November of this year. The course is currently full, but will be offered again in the spring, and then on a regular basis. We will keep you posted.

Provider Course:

- The only program designed to provide nurses with the knowledge needed to safely administer chemotherapy and biotherapy to children and adolescents with cancer.
- Each participant receives The Pediatric Chemotherapy and Biotherapy Curriculum; a 250page book, the only comprehensive curriculum pertaining to pediatric chemotherapy and biotherapy administration.
- Participants receive instruction on the difference between adult and pediatric cancers, clinical trials, chemotherapy and biotherapy agents and administration, side effects, toxicity and symptom management, psychosocial issues and legal and ethical issues. This 2-day course offers 16.5 nursing contact hours.

Following course attendance successful completion of an exam, participants are issued an APON pediatric chemotherapy and biotherapy provider card that recognizes that the participant has met APON educational standards for chemotherapy and biotherapy administration to children and adolescents. The card indicates the nurse has the knowledge required to administer pediatric chemotherapy and biotherapy, but does not ensure clinical competence. Resources for measurement of clinical competence are provided in the curriculum. Mary Jean Howitt

Delphi Technique

Cancer Care Nova Scotia is currently working on a Distress Management Guideline for Adults. The psychosocial working group for APPHON has decided that they are going to work on a Distress Management Guideline for Pediatrics.

In order to make sure that there is a good representation of ideas and that all disciplines have input into a Distress Management Guideline we have decided to conduct a Delphi technique. We will hopefully get a good response from members of APPHON that will result in a guideline that will be useful. We want to make sure that the guideline will be something that will be beneficial to you and your patients.

We will be contacting people to participate in the next few weeks. It will only take a few minutes a week to complete and is done via e-mail. Instructions will follow in the weeks to come.
